## FIVE MINUTE ANTIQUE SCHOOL-PENNSYLVANIA CHALKWARE

- Chalkware is an unfired pottery made of plaster of paris
- Chalkware is made of two half molds, glued together & painted with watercolor or oils
- Chalkware is hollow & was made in the 18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, probably originating in Italy
   where religious figures have been found. It then migrated to Germany & the New Word
- Most pieces have been found in the Pennsylvania German areas
- Chalkware was sold by peddlers in the 19<sup>th</sup> century & continued in popularity until the 1880's
- Chalkware is a true folk art. It's making required skill but no formal training. Forms of Chalkware are dogs,cats,squirrels,roosters,doves,parrots,sheep,& deer. Fruit or flower compotes are less common.

A later version of Chalkware was found in fairs & carnivals. They were solid not hollow & were usually cartoonish figures & animals. These were replaced in the 1960's by stuffed animals

Pricing: Chalkware should be in the best original condition. No chips,breaks or mends. The
more original paint the better. The most unusual forms with good color command the highest
prices.

There are reproductions, but plaster cannot be aged and newer pieces are heavier in weight
